In the BL Map Library there are a number of loose sheets believed to belong to a Wyld Atlas tentatively suggested/identified by Chubb as being *'Wylds atlas of English Counties. London J.Wyld 1842.'* Chubb listed this after reading an entry in 'The London Catalogue of Books published in Great Britain from 1814-1846', to date no complete copy has been located. However, the 8 loose maps in the Map Library are all later flat sheet copies of the Wallis 1812 long quarto map series,

These 11 counties have been found in mixed formats, single flat sheets, folding & dissected and in the case of Berkshire Burden [iv] one copy in 'W.Archdeacon's Directory of Reading for 1851.' with dates varying from the 1840s to the 1880s, indicating multiple issues, but in view of the above comments other counties might exist in later states. These known examples show some updating/ additions e.g.Railways & Census Figures of several distinct periods i.e.1861 or later, 1876 or later and finally 1881 or later.
