Sheets 20-21(<u>DW coll</u>) dated April 2nd 1832 [but probably c1847-]as Railways 1-8,A-B, appear on this copy. There was probably another <u>intaglio</u> issue as there is a map with the TW/ Robertsbridge line(opened 1851) shown Cary style [dls with jagged tooth pattern].

It was later published by GF Cruchley as 'Cruchleys Reduced Ordnance Map of E & W' also in single sheets under the title of 'A New Topographical Map of the Environs of...' using one or more of sheets 13,14,20,21. Additionally a issue titled 'Cruchley's Complete Railway & Station Map of England & Wales with part of Scotland' c1881-2. These sheets are updated both by addition and deletion. Cruchley normally used simple dls on the plates and solid black lines on the lithographs for rail lines, but the 1881-2 issue is an exception it has no solid black lines. Sheets 20 & 21 comprise approximately 90% of the county and as such, under Cruchley and Gall & Inglis are frequently used as a Map of Kent alone.
