It is of course a Marine Chart rather than a map of the River Thames but added to the River File for Thames information purposes. It comprises two sections, the main R.Thames upper section is approximately 1/3 rd of the whole and covers the River Thames from London to The Nore with a compass pointer just off the Isle of Grain, sandbanks and water depths detailed. In the Lower R is a title and scale "Astekening van de Rivier van London of River Thames" & Astekening van de Iarmouthse Banken gelegen ... " From the image on eBay it contains a notable error in naming Kent as 'HEY LANDERHAE ESSEX' and Essex as "CANTI OF KENT" [below which it names Gerard van Keulen] otherwise a good illustration of the river.
