

NON SERIES HUNT MAPS Part 1

The maps below are mostly 'working' copies but some examples noted are simply part of the illustrations within a book or magazine, and sometimes mentioned in County Carto-Bibliographies.

The hunting fraternity use the terminology 'Great Run' to describe a particularly exhilarating or memorable days hunt, often these are described, mapped and reproduced in books and magazines. I took the view that these were not proper hunting maps and have therefore described a selection for those who might show an interest in these, they appear in the Appendix.7

Any text in blue e.g. '**CAPT SPICER**' informs the reader of some form of change or amendment to the previous copy and might be a addition, deletion, or even a change of font from lower to uppercase or visa versa.

With the exception of the title there is no indication this is other than a general Cheltenham Environs map.

The absence of the Stanford label uncovers the Bartholomew imprint obbr 'COPYRIGHT- JOHN BARTHOLOMEW & Co., EDIN.R' The Letters and Figures in the Margin refer to the dated [1909-10 Season] index, within the front cover. The actual map in all essentials appears unchanged, but there is much overprinting of additional numbers and symbols of Meets for many of the hunts, these are easily identified as they lack the dark colour borders of the originals.

Although there are no amendments on the map, at this point the former Eastbourne Harriers under Hunt Master A B Wrangham becomes the EASTBOURNE FOXHOUNDS under a new MFH Freeman Thomas Esq and although a new Meet symbol is suggested in the Meets Listing this is not shown on the map face, only a orange coloured area to indicate the change.

Hunt Maps by MacDonald Gill are rare, to date only two distinctly different examples are known, and much of the following notes are surmised / assumed from assessment of the few images available. Usually a Wind Dial map is painted directly on to a wood panel and set into a wall or fireplace to allow connection to the house wind vane, it is assumed that this is so in this case.The quality of the painted lettering on the Pytchley Hunt Map example is excellent, remarkable even considering it is painted directly onto a wall. Neither of these examples serve much practical purpose in this Carto-Bibliography as they are plainly unique items and are simply recorded as examples of Gills' work..

'Hunt Map of the area encompassing part of The Quorn & The Cottesmore Hunts'.

Until 1947 a 'Wind Dial' Map in Burrough House Leicester and used by Sir Raymond Greene.Bt whilst he lived at Burrough House until he died in 1947, its continued existence is as yet unconfirmed but assumed from the PPC information below, which is currently the only known proof of existence of this map.

A Picture Postcard recently discovered in the Record Office of Leicester, Leicestershire & Rutland. [Rollr]. This PPC carries dates 1924 up to a date for a assigned '© BURROUGH HOUSE 1997.'.

Many of Gills Wind Dial Maps were commissions for Architect Sir Edwin Lutyens, but the Burrough Hall Wind Dial map may well have been a private commission, it appeared Sir Raymond had a more practical than a decorative interest in this map, as he and the household apparently referred to it as the '..Hunting Map...', [the map covered large areas of both The Quorn & The Cottesmore Hunts, evidently he was a keen Huntsman.] The PPC in Rollr refers to this Wind Dial map as 'The Hunting Map' so this assumption is reinforced.

The compass points are shown by N.S.E.W. in hollow uppercase letters roughly around the centre of the map, each corner has a named 'Wind Cherub', BOREAS, EURUS, AUSTER, ZEPHYRUS. There is a heavy line West to East approximately two thirds down from the top of the map, purpose unknown. The map displays the major Cities,Towns and Villages in a 'Pictographic' form, of Buildings, Houses,Halls and Churches &c, Main and Side Roads,Parklands,

Forests & Woodland areas. In the Lower L corner from the illustration there appears to be some form of writing possibly a signature but not legible.
